TRESPASS POLICY

The Long Bay College Board of Trustees acts on behalf of the Crown as occupier of the college property and in the interests of protecting persons and/or property under its control.

The Board authorises designated persons to invoke the Trespass Act against unwanted persons on the college property.

The Board gives to the Principal, the Associate Principal, the Deputy Principals, or the Property Manager the formal authority to "warn (trespassers) to leave" and/or to "stay off" the property of the Board.

The Board gives to the Principal formal authority to request that the Police issue a trespass notice to unwanted person(s) on College property. Such person(s) may include students formally excluded or expelled from the College.

Such personnel are required to act according to procedures which recognise in addition to the Trespass Act (1980) the Crimes Act (1961) and the Education Act (1964).

Procedures will include reference to:

- 1 Trespass Act (1980) (especially S.3, S.4, S.5, S.9, S.11).
- 2 Crimes Act (1961) S.56 or its updates.
- 3 Education Act (1964) S.195 or its updates.

This policy is intended to be consistent with the requirements of the Privacy Act, 1993.
